



Idefonso Hernández-Aguado MD, PhD, MPH

Professor of Preventive Medicine and Public Health and Head of the Department of Public Health, History of Science and Gynecology at the Universidad Miguel Hernández (Spain). Former President of the National Commission for Postgraduate Training (Residency) on Preventive Medicine and Public Health.

Dr Hernández-Aguado has conducted research in diverse areas, from the epidemiology of infectious diseases or clinical epidemiology to health service research. At present his priorities lie in health governance, public health policy and ethics. He has authored over 180 papers in peer-reviewed journals. He is co-editor or author of several books on public health. He has directed 15 doctoral theses and 14 funded research projects. He was Deputy Editor of the Journal of Epidemiology and Community Health (1998-2008).

Dr Hernández-Aguado was Director General of Public Health in the Spanish Government (2008-2011). He was also member of the Management Board of the European Centre for Disease Control and of the WHO Scientific Committee: European Review on Social Determinants and the Health Divide. He was elected to the Standing Committee of the Regional Committee for Europe (WHO). As Director of Public Health, he directed the drafting of the priority of the Spanish Presidency of the European Union on Social Determinants of Health. He directed the work on the Spanish Law of Public Health and on the anti-smoking legislation. He has been member of the Steering Committee of the Spanish Centre for Research on Epidemiology and Public Health.

He was President of the Spanish Epidemiological Association (2003-2007) and is now Past President of the Spanish Public Health and Health Administration Association.

He has been a member of international and national panels on research policy, planning and evaluation. He has been temporary advisor to several institutions including the WHO, Spanish Government, EU and South American and Middle Eastern Universities. He is founder of the Summer School of Public Health (Menorca, Spain).
