MICHAEL MOORE is the CEO of the Public Health Association of Australia (PHAA). He has been nominated by the PHAA for the position of Vice-President of the World Federation of Public Health Associations (WFPHA) as a person of energy and vision who took a key role in rebuilding the PHAA and ensuring that key health issues were on government agendas. The experience he brings to WFPHA includes advocacy and networking in areas such as the health impacts of International Treaties; climate change and health; immunisation; tobacco, alcohol and food policy; board and NGO governance. He believes the WFPHA is poised to have an even greater impact on international health policy through involving the membership, networking and engaging with governments.

He is a former Independent Member of Parliament and was Minister of Health and Community Care in the Australian Capital Territory for four terms from 1989 to 2001. He was the first Australian Independent Member to be appointed as a Minister to a Government Executive. He has developed considerable skills in governance, advocacy and health policy.

Michael holds a post-graduate diploma in education, a master's degree in population health, is an adjunct professor with the University of Canberra. He is widely published as a political and social columnist and in peer review journals. His experience in serving on a range of boards and scientific committees would be invaluable as a council member of the WFPHA. These boards and committees include the WFPHA Kolkata Congress, many PHAA and

related conference committees, the ACT Local Hospital Network Council, Australian Health Care Reform Alliance, the National Drug Research Institute, ACT Asthma Network and the Institute of Public Administration.
